[Luís Gaspar](#) was born in Lisbon in 1973. He completed the Acting Programme at the Escola Superior de Teatro e Cinema of the National Conservatory. He also attended several workshops, including with the Belgian theatre company STAN, Bruce Myers (a collaborator of Peter Brook), João Fiadeiro, among others. He made his debut in 1997 in the production Prometeu, directed by Jorge Silva Melo for Artistas Unidos. Still with Artistas Unidos and under Silva Melo's direction, he joined the cast of several productions. At Teatro da Cornucópia, he worked with directors such as Christine Laurent, Ricardo Aibéo and Luís Assis. He has also worked with directors Cucha Carvalheiro, Cristina Carvalhal, Fernanda Lapa, Maria Emília Correia, Graça P. Correa, Madalena Vitorino, João Mota, Miguel Seabra, Natália Luíza, Paulo Matos, Alfredo Brissos, André Murraças, Carlos Gomes, Ricardo Neves-Neves, Carlos Pimenta, Rui Neto, Hugo Franco, among others.

Across 27 years of career, he has been part of numerous television projects, including series, TV films and soap operas such as Maiores de 20, A Senhora das Águas, Último Beijo, Coração Malandro, Morangos com Açúcar, Aqui Não Há Quem Viva, Pai à Força, A Noite do Fim do Mundo, O Primogénito, Teorias da Conspiração, Anjo Meu, Sinais de Vida, O Beijo do Escorpião, Mulheres, Santa Bárbara, Rainha das Flores, A Odisseia (for ARTE), Espelho d'Água, Alma e Coração, Na Corda Bamba, Bem Me Quer, Festa é Festa, among others.

In cinema, he appeared in films such as António, Um Rapaz de Lisboa by Jorge Silva Melo, Bairro by Jorge Cardoso, Lourenço de Mello and José Manuel Fernandes, Tabu by Miguel Gomes, Salgueiro Maia – O Implicado by Sérgio Graciano, among others. He won the TV7Dias Award for Best Ensemble Actor for his role as Jorge in the soap opera Mulheres, and the CineEuphoria Award for Best Ensemble for Tabu. He was also nominated for Best Leading Actor at the Fantastic Awards for the soap operas Mulheres and Rainha das Flores.
